

He Leaping Up Stood

Acts 3:1-9

Well, what a wonderful time it is to be living for the Lord, and what a wonderful time it is to be able to share with this world Jesus. In just a few moments, we're going to be looking in Acts chapter 3, verses 1 through 9. We're going to look at a man who was bringing praise to God.

Now, in Acts chapter 3 and verse 1. ¹Now Peter and John went up together into the temple at the hour of prayer, [being] the ninth [hour]. ²And a

certain man lame from his mother's womb was carried, whom they laid daily at the gate of the temple which is called Beautiful, to ask alms of them that entered into the temple; ³Who seeing Peter and John about to go into the temple asked an alms.

He was a beggar. Verse 4 continues on by saying, ⁴And Peter, fastening his eyes upon him with John, said, Look on us. ⁵And he gave heed unto them, expecting to receive something of them. ⁶Then Peter said, Silver and gold have I none; but such as I have give I thee: In the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth rise up and walk. ⁷And he took him by the right hand, and lifted [him] up: and immediately his feet and ankle bones received strength. ⁸And he leaping up stood, and walked, and entered with them into the temple, walking, and leaping, and praising God. And verse 9 says, *And all the people saw him walking and praising God.*

What a wonderful sight that must have been. This man, leaping up, he stood. He stood as a witness to the Word of God. The Word of God. The Scriptures. The Word of God is given by the inspiration of God. In 2 Timothy 3:16, it says, *All scripture [is] given by inspiration of God, and [is] profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness.*

We also see that the Holy Scripture was given by the inspiration of the Holy Ghost. In 2 Peter, chapter 1, verse 21, it says, *For the prophecy came not in old time by the will of man: but holy men of God spake [as they were] moved by the Holy Ghost.*

Christ also taught out of the Holy Scriptures. In Luke chapter 24 and verse 27: *And beginning at Moses and all the prophets, he expounded unto*

them in all the scriptures the things concerning himself. Well, the Scriptures, the Holy Scriptures, also testify of the Lord Jesus. In John chapter 5 and verse 39, it says, *Search the scriptures; for in them ye think ye have eternal life: and they are they which testify of me.* In Acts chapter 10, verse 43, it says, *To him give all the prophets witness....* talking about Jesus. *To him....* Jesus.... *give all the prophets witness that through his name whosoever believeth in him shall receive remission of sins.*

Acts chapter 18, verse 28, it says, *For he mightily convinced the Jews, [and that] publicly, shewing by the scriptures that Jesus was Christ.* And then 1 Corinthians 15:3 says, *For I delivered unto you first of all that which I also received, how that Christ died for our sins according to the scriptures.* The Word is true. The Scriptures are true. The Bible says in Romans 3:4, *[L]et God be true, but every man a liar....*

[T]he Word was made flesh and dwelt among us. Jesus Christ, the author and finisher of our faith. In John chapter 1, verse 14, *And the Word was made flesh, and dwelt among us, (and we beheld his glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father,) full of grace and truth.*

On and on, the Bible talks about the Scriptures, how that the living Scripture, how that the living Word, Jesus, came into this world to die for sinful men and women. Well, this man in Acts chapter 3, verses 1 through 9, he stood as a living witness to the power of God. God's power. God's omnipotence. God's power is perfect and unlimited. His being is almighty and all powerful. In Matthew chapter 19, verse 26, the Bible says, *But Jesus beheld [them], and said unto them, With men this is impossible....* Notice.... *but with God all things are possible.*

In Psalms chapter 62 and verse 11, it says, *God hath spoken once; twice have I heard this; that power [belongeth] unto God.*

God's power is described as great in Psalm 79:11, and on and on, the Bible talks about His strength, His power. His power is strong, Psalm 89:13. His power is glorious, Exodus 15:6. His power is mighty, Job chapter 9 and verse 4. His power is everlasting, Isaiah 26:4. His power is sovereign, Romans 9:21. His power is effectual, Isaiah 43:13. His power is irresistible, Deuteronomy 32:39. His power is incomparable, Exodus 15, verses 11 through 12. His power is unsearchable, Job 5:9. His power is incomprehensible, Job 26:14. It says there, *Lo, these [are] parts of his ways: but how little a portion is heard of him? but the thunder of his power who can understand?*

Ecclesiastes 3:11 says, *He hath made every [thing] beautiful in his time: also he hath set the world in their heart, so that no man can find out the work that God maketh from the beginning to the end.*

God is powerful. This man stood as a witness to the power of God. He stood as a witness of the power of Christ to heal. Acts chapter 3 and verse 6 says, *Then Peter said, Silver and gold have I none; but such as I have give I thee: In the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth rise up and walk.*

The Bible, contrary to popular belief, does not promise help to those who help themselves. That may come as a shock to you today. The Bible does not promise to help those who help themselves. In Isaiah 40:29, it says, *He giveth power to the faint; and to [them that have] no might he increaseth strength.*

Second Chronicles 20:12 says, *O our God, wilt thou not judge them? for we have no might against this great company that cometh against*

us; neither know we what to do: but our eyes [are] upon thee.

How do we get our country to turn back to the Lord today? How do we get our country to realize that Jesus is the only way? We need to fall on our faces today and say, "God, I have no power in myself. I'm depending upon You. Lord, help our land to turn back to You. Help us to repent and turn from our wicked ways and to do what You would have us to do as a nation. Help us, Lord, to help others find Jesus as their Savior. Help us to be a witness to His power."

Well, this man was a witness in Acts chapter 3. He stood as a witness of the power of Christ to make whole. In Acts chapter 4, verses 8 through 10, it says, ⁸*Then Peter, filled with the Holy Ghost, said unto them, Ye rulers of the people, and elders of Israel, ⁹If we this day be examined of the good deed done to the impotent man...he's speaking of the man now who was healed.... by what means he is made whole; ¹⁰Be it known unto you all, and to all the people of Israel, that by the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, whom ye crucified, whom God raised from the dead, [even] by him doth this man stand here before you whole.*

This man stood as a witness to the power of Christ to make whole, to take care of him, to make him, to heal him. Well, this man also stood as a witness against unbelievers.

In Acts chapter 4, verses 11 and 12, it says, ¹¹*This is the stone which was set at nought of you builders, which is become the head of the corner.* This man stood, and by him being healed, Peter was able to preach a great message that day. In verse 12, it says, *Neither is there salvation in any other: for there is none other name under heaven given among men, whereby we must be saved.*

In verse 11 of Acts chapter 4, Peter was quoting Psalm 118:22, and Jesus quoted this verse in

Matthew chapter 21, verses 23 and 42. This is one of the clearest statements that can be found anywhere setting forth the way of salvation.

Only Christ can save for He hath both created and sustains all things. He Himself has made this plain in John chapter 14:6. As offensive as such a truth may be to non-Christians, we must continually make it clear in our witness to them, for without Christ, they are lost and bound for hell. There is no other way to Heaven other than through Jesus.

This man also stood as a witness for those who are believers. Acts chapter 4 and verse 13, *Now when they saw the boldness of Peter and John, and perceived that they were unlearned and ignorant men, they marvelled; and they took knowledge of them, that they had been with Jesus.*

Have you been with Jesus today? Have you bowed your head and had communion with Him today. Have you prayed? Have you talked with Jesus today? Have you been in His Word? Have you read it today that He might speak to your heart?

This man also stood as a witness against the devil and those who are in opposition to the miraculous work of God in those who work by faith. Acts chapter 4 and verse 14 talks about that. I wonder today, have you trusted Jesus as your Savior? Have you asked Him to come into your heart? The Bible says there is no other way other than through Christ. That is the only way. It's not by works of righteousness which we have done but according to His mercy that He saves us. In Ephesians chapter 2, verses 8 and 9, it says, ⁸*For by grace are ye saved through faith; and that not of yourselves: [it is] the gift of God: ⁹Not of works, lest any man should boast.*

Right where you're at today, why not bow your head and ask Jesus to come into your heart? He's waiting for you. He wants to save you today.

“Lord, come into my heart. I receive you as my Savior.”

And Christian, today, are you standing up? Are you leaping for the Lord? Are you giving a Christian testimony to the fact of what He's done for you, that He saved you and He's made you fit for Heaven? Are you doing that? If not, may I invite you to bow your head where you're at and pray and ask God's forgiveness, not for salvation but because you are saved.

Help them, Lord. Help these people to live for You today.
