## **Homosexuality – Study 2**

Thank you for joining me once again for "It's a Good Life." Last time, we started a study on the subject of homosexuality. In fact, it's a Biblical perspective on the term "homosexuality." I use the word "term," but it is actually sin, according to the Word of God.

Last time, we looked at the sin of sodomy and we looked at some of the things that God says. It's grievous and it's not right, according to the Word of God.

We also looked at the fact that homosexuality is shameful. It is an abomination. We read Leviticus 18:24-30 and we saw how that, because of the sinful people who lived in the land before the Israelites came there to live, God said that these people who lived in the land would be cast out. I read this the last time in verses 24 and 25. I read those verses and it's these very acts that defiled the land, according to God, the act of homosexuality.

Because of these abominable practices, God removed, vomited out, certain nations from the land of Palestine, according to verses 27 and 28 of Leviticus Chapter 18. God warns His people that, if they should practice any of these abominations, they would be cut off from among the people, Verse 29.

Gentile nations of the past have been severely judged by God because of such practices of homosexuality and the land is defiled. Therefore, He says, *I do visit the iniquity thereof upon it and the land itself vomiteth out her inhabitants,* Leviticus 18:25. Americans would do well to heed this serious and sober warning. Judgment of God is coming to this land.

What about the penalty for homosexuality under the Mosaic Law? The homosexual community blames the Christians for the problems they have. No, their problem is homosexuality. The homosexual community says the laws are too strict that we have today. I've got news for you. Had they lived back under the Mosaic Law, let me say they have seen nothing today in comparison to the Mosaic Law. In Leviticus 20:13, it says, *If a man also lie with mankind as he lieth with a woman, both of them have committed an abomination. They shall surely be put to death. Their blood shall be upon them,* Leviticus 20:13.

In that verse, the term "mankind" is the Hebrew term for male. If a man lies with a male as one lies with a female, they shall surely be put to death under the Mosaic Law. If you were living in the days of Moses under this law of God, homosexuality was punishable by death. The death penalty was demanded. The Hebrew construction, "they shall surely be put to death," is very similar to that found in Genesis 2:17 where it says for in the day that thou eatest thereof thou... that's Adam... shalt surely die.

And Adam did die spiritually and one day he died physically just as you and I if we do not trust Jesus Christ. We're born once in this world to die twice unless we're born twice and then we only die once. Because we trust Jesus Christ, we're born again.

The Bible says there that the Jews who demanded Christ's death by crucifixion were saying, "We take full responsibility for Christ's death," and this is what the homosexual is saying: "I'm taking full responsibility for what I do, and I will take the consequences."

When we look at this in the full perspective that God has given us, we need to understand that the penalty for homosexuality under the Mosaic Law was death. How good God is in His mercy to us that He allows anyone and everyone, no matter who you are, what you think, anyone and everyone He allows all of us to come to a saving knowledge of Jesus Christ. And if you go to Hell, you have no one to blame but yourself.

In Leviticus 20:13, God tells us that those men who engaged in a homosexual act were fully responsible for their deed and had to bear the consequences of it, namely, the death penalty. These men were fully responsible for the sin that they committed.

Homosexuality is not some inborn, innate tendency over which a man has no control. Rather, it is something that a man chooses to do and God holds him fully responsible for that action. And may I say, when I'm saying "man," I'm speaking of mankind. I'm speaking of women as well.

A man can never legitimately say, "I could not help it. I was born this way. I have no control over my sexual conduct. I'm not responsible for my actions, and I should not be punished for something that I could not help. I can't change what and who I am."

No! This man was fully responsible for his own death and this is Adam, of course. He was fully responsible and the blood was upon him because he chose to commit a crime worthy of death, and so is the homosexual responsible for his own crime.

Note this, the fact that homosexuals were to face the death penalty under the Law of Moses does not mean that this penalty is to be inflicted today. In Exodus 21:17, we learn that

under the Law of Moses the death penalty was enforced even for a person who curses his father or mother. It says there, *And he that curseth his father or his mother shall surely be put to death.* Even though we look at this law under the Mosaic Law, even though the severe penalty is no longer enforced, such passages from the law show us the seriousness of the sin in God's eyes, whether it be homosexuality or parental disrespect.

As we look at this, we look at Deuteronomy 23:17-18. It says there, <sup>17</sup>There shall be no whore of the daughters of Israel, nor a sodomite of the sons of Israel. <sup>18</sup>Thou shalt not bring the hire of a whore, or the price of a dog, into the house of the LORD thy God for any vow: for even both these are abomination unto the LORD thy God.

Many denominational churches today, churches of different denominations, are allowing homosexuals to be members of their local congregations. God says it's wrong. Many so-called "Biblical" churches today are allowing homosexuals to get married within their system, whatever you want to call it, and God says that is a sin. Judgment is coming.

The verses I just read, Deuteronomy 23:17-18, these verses deal with what was a common practice in the heathen world, namely, temple prostitution. The heathen temples were cesspools of immorality and fornication and prostitution. A man could enter such a temple and for a price could choose either a female or a male sexual partner. That word and that term "whore" found in Deuteronomy 23 refers to a female prostitute, and the term "sodomite" refers to a male prostitute, Deuteronomy 23:17. And the term "dog," Deuteronomy 23:18, refers to the sodomite of verse 17.

The term "sodomite" comes from a Hebrew root which means holy. How in the world could such an unholy prostitute be called holy? The answer is found in the fact that the basic meaning of the term "holy" is to set apart, and this man was set apart, not for holy purposes but for very immoral purposes, for sinful purposes. The term "sodomite" is employed in the Authorized Version, that's the King James Bible, of the Old Testament for those who practice as a religious rite the abominable and unnatural vice from which the inhabitants of Sodom and Gomorrah have derived their lasting infamy. That comes from *Smith's Bible Dictionary*.

This term is used repeatedly in the books of I Kings and II Kings. In the days of Rehoboam, Solomon's son, we read this. *And there were also sodomites in the land: and they did according to all the abominations of the nations which the LORD cast out before the children of Israel,* I Kings 14:24.

And in Deuteronomy, God said that there must not be any sodomite among the sons of Israel. In the days of Rehoboam, there were sodomites among the sons of Israel. It was a time of great spiritual decline. That's happened to our country today. It says there in the book of Deuteronomy, And Judah did evil in the sight of the LORD, and they provoked him to jealousy with their sins which they had committed, above all that their fathers had done. This is in I Kings 14:22.

Later, after Rehoboam, there were certain Godly kings in Judah who rectified this problem of temple prostitution. As a did that which was right in the eyes of the LORD, according to I Kings 15:11, and the first recorded right act that he did was to banish the sodomites from the land. If it's not sin, why were they banished? You say, "Well, that's persecution." No, that's doing the things that

God wants us to do. That's enforcing God's law. That's enforcing what God says that it is... an abomination. Homosexuality is not right.

First Kings 15:11-12 said, <sup>11</sup>And Asa did that which was right in the eyes of the LORD, as did David his father. <sup>12</sup>And he took away the sodomites out of the land, and removed all the idols that his fathers had made.

Later, this abominable practice again took root, but in the days of Jehoshaphat, the sodomites were again banished from the land, according to I Kings 22:46. In the days of Josiah, these sodomites had brought their tents or huts or ritual booths right into the courtyard of God's temple, but Godly King Josiah got rid of them. He said, "Get 'em out of here. They don't belong in the house of God with God's people."

Let me say that there's one way that you can fit in with God's people, and that's to become a child of God. You need to receive Jesus Christ as your Lord and Savior. The Bible teaches us that, to as many as received Him, to them gave He power to become the sons, the children of God, to all them who believe. If you will trust Jesus Christ as your Savior right now, He'll save you.

I realize what I'm speaking of here. It touches people and people need to be touched. They need to understand that this sin of homosexuality is wrong, but I've got news for you. You can be saved today. You can receive Jesus as your Savior and one day you, too, will go to Heaven because you have trusted Jesus Christ as your Lord and Savior. And He's the only way that any of us will ever go to Heaven.
